

Recognizing Technical Information in the Bible Solves Long Standing Mysteries

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The bible is true, but theologians have a hard time with it. Theologians typically get technical information wrong. This reflects poorly on the credibility of the bible. But that need not be so. Recognition of technical Information bolsters credibility of bible.

If there really is a creator, and if eternal life really exists as promised in the Judeo-Christian bible, and if that bible really is the communication from the creator to humans, then the technical information in that bible should be consistent with reality.

A careful study of the technical information in the bible reveals the fact that its technical information is consistent with reality. But it also reveals the fact that theologians typically get the biblical technical information wrong. Why is this? Partially it may be due to the fact that humans did not know what the ancient scripture was talking about when outside their realm. Partially it may be that humans had religious myths that overshadowed their interpretation. But if the bible really is a communication from a higher power that intends to communicate with its created beings, what went wrong? Maybe it did not go wrong. Maybe it was intended to be that way so as to demonstrate that religious humans cannot make up correct technical information by showing that even if they were originally given it correctly, they cannot even keep it correct. Maybe that is intentional to show that the correct technical information in that communication is actually from a higher intelligence than humans. Perhaps it is to demonstrate that reality by leaving it up to science of today to discover that ancient technical information is of super human origin.

Theologians typically interpret the biblical technical information wrong.

Discovering technical information recorded in the ancient Hebrew Scriptures, in the Old Testament of the Bible, reveals many previously unrecognized facts about the past that apparently were known thousands of years ago, but lost to humanity until rediscovered by modern science.

A wealth of technical information has been locked up in the Ancient Scriptures, unrecognized by modern day scholars, both religious and secular. Many biblical creation accounts have not been recognized as such simply because of the fact that the information recorded therein is technical, not religious.

Recognizing technical information requires the acceptance of a few prerequisites.

Accept the fact that Words have meaning. The technical meaning of the original words used to record that information is, in many cases, overshadowed by traditional religious meaning of the words they have been translated into.

Accept the fact that Context has meaning. Once a passage of scripture is recognized to be a record of technical information in chronological order, one versed in the technical information therein can overcome the religious bias in translation and recognize technical details in part due to their position in the chronological order.

Accept the fact that Theologians typically get it wrong when interpreting the technical information recorded in ancient scripture.

These basics have actually led to the recognition and publication of technical details recorded in ancient scripture before the discovery and publication of the same technical details by modern science thereby predicting or anticipating future discovery by modern science.

This is evidence of the fact that the accusation of reinterpreting scripture to agree with science is false.
